## “Church and State in the Carolingian Era”

**The Format:** A thoughtful presentation will be shared, followed by two invited responders and then open group dialogue, to discern its resonance with vibrant Christian faith.

**Presentation Synopsis:** The fall of the Roman Empire caused a collapse in social and political infrastructures across northern Europe. The resulting instability left neither political leaders nor Christian missionaries with sufficient resources to establish and maintain a foothold. Recognizing in one another strengths necessary to forge a new society, the agents of church and state formed mutually beneficial alliances. The Carolingian Empire grew and flourished as one such merger, benefiting from the combined assets of church and state, even as it forced both parties to compromise core principles.

**Speaker Biography:** Carol Scheppard is Professor of the College at Bridgewater College where she has been a member of the faculty since 1998. She holds a BA in Anthropology from Wesleyan University, a M.Ed. in Special Education from Lesley College, a M.Div. from Princeton Theology Seminary and a Ph.D. in Religious Studies from the University of Pennsylvania. Her scholarship addresses early medieval monasticism and biblical interpretation. In 2017, Carol served as Moderator for the Church of the Brethren. She lives on a small farm in Augusta County and enjoys playing the bagpipes.
